2018 Gottstein Wood Science Course hosted by the Fenner School of Environment and Society (ANU)

Every year the Gottstein Trust organises a one-week course alternating between Forest Science and Wood Science, as part of the investment in forestry and wood sciences education. These courses are tailored for people new to the forestry and wood science industries, including executives.

The 2018 Wood Science Course will be held at the Fenner School at the Australian National University – ACT for the first time. ANU history with forestry dates back to 1965, when it incorporated the Australian Forestry School (AFS).

The Gottstein Trust promotes the development of the forest products industry through the pursuit of excellence in people, processes and products since its establishment in 1971.

J.W. (Bill) Gottstein was a forest products research scientist working for the CSIRO, who was tragically killed in 1971 while photographing a tree-felling operation in New Guinea. The trust encourages people to acquire knowledge which will promote the interests of Australian industries.

The Trust is proud to have awarded fellowships and scholarships to the combined value of approximately \$500K over the last 10 years.
